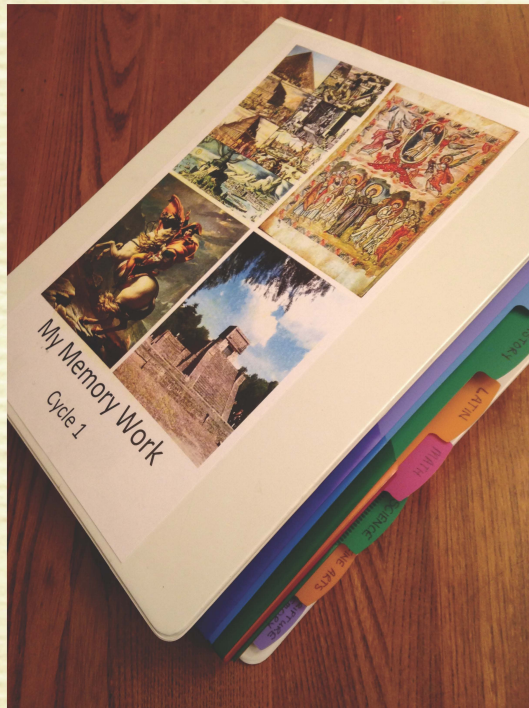


BINDER-BOOK

LAYOUT

GUIDE



This document contains the Binder-Book layout option. Using the same “My Memory Work Lapbook” files 1.1-1.4, you may choose to use either the tri-folder lapbook layout option, in which each tri-folder lapbook covers six weeks, or use the Binder-book option, in which a single three-ring binder contains all of the memory work. The Tri-folder option is described within each six-week file. This document describes the Binder-Book layout option.

Layout Suggestions and Helps

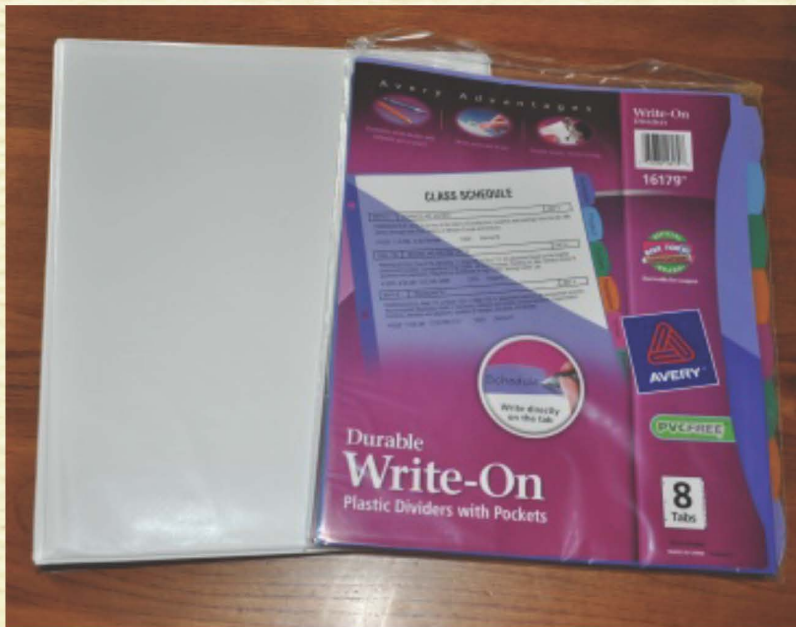
There are two options for your Lapbook layout. One is to use the "Tri-Folder Lapbook" layout which is described in each file and another is to use a 3-ring binder and create a "Binder-Book".

The Lapbook version will group your memory work into six week sections (this coordinates with the way the books were created). The Binder-Book will place all of the pieces into a single three-ring notebook using cardstock pages. Layout suggestions are provided for both options. Remember your lapbook is your own unique creation. These layouts are only a suggestion.

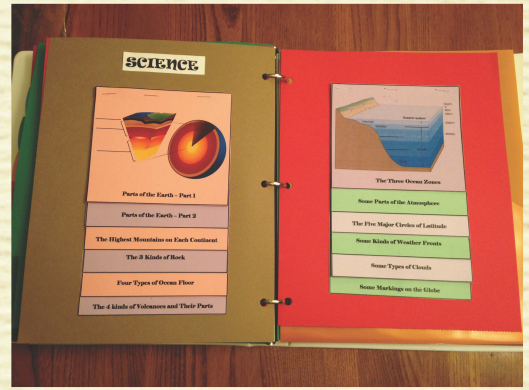
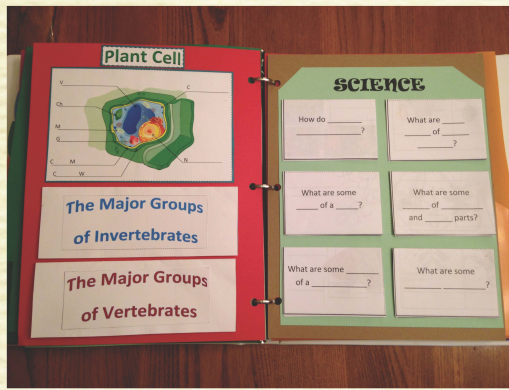
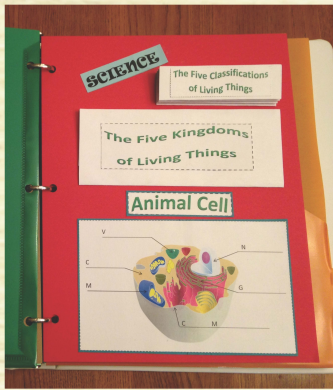
Binder-Book Layout Option:

An alternate layout option for your Memory Work is the Binder-Book. It consists of a three-ring notebook filled with cardstock pages. You can attach the templates to the cardstock pages within the Binder. I have chosen to sort the templates by subject using an 8-subject divider pack. The thing I love about the Binder-Book option is that it is easy to add extra items like science experiment information, worksheets, pictures, or small crafts relating to your CC Memory Work topic. It also eliminates the segregation of material by six week increments, and so can offer a more cohesive layout. However, it is a little less interactive. If you choose this option, there are a couple of things you might want to know.

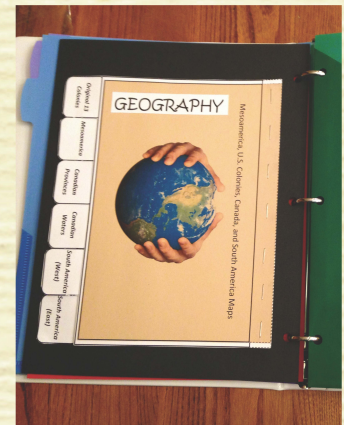
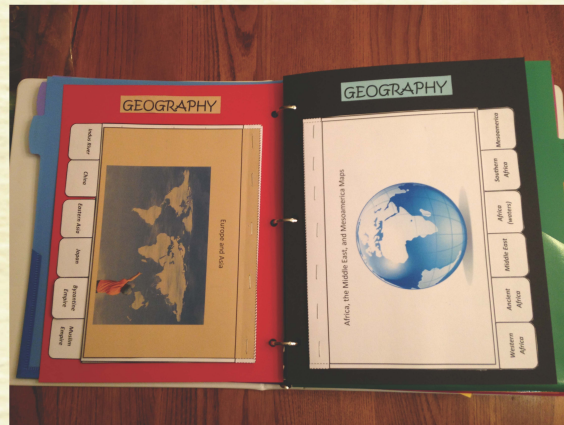
- 1. A Title page to slip inside your binder can be found at the back of this file.*

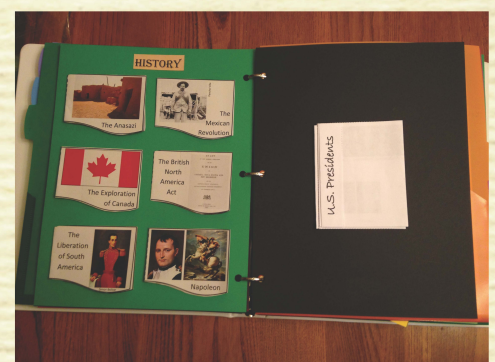
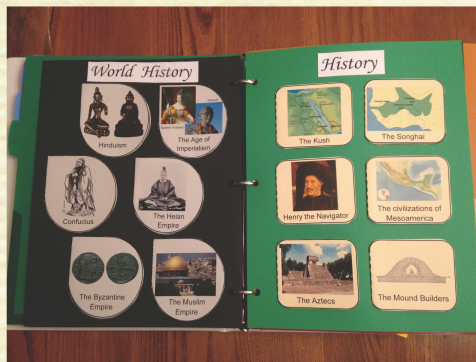
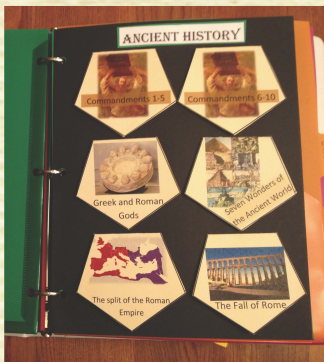
2" Binder (2 1/2" if you plan to add other items into the book). I chose to use a package of 8 write-on dividers to separate the subjects. This turned out to be useful to store cut templates according to subject. If you are planning to assemble the binder as you study the material, I would use this method. I also chose to store the additional pieces sorted according to topic in these pockets. This way, it will be easy for us to use them to record other interesting things we learned about our subjects. Additional lapbook pieces, worksheets, projects, etc will be placed by topic behind the memory work. The cover and Side-Label are found in this document. Since I group the memory work together, by subject, the pictures below may include multiple templates per page from various weeks.



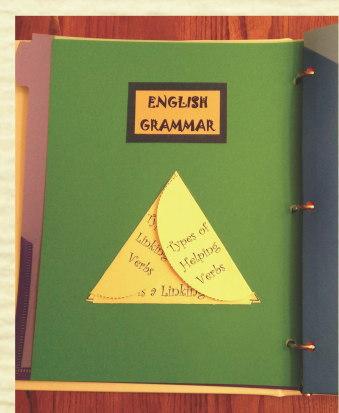
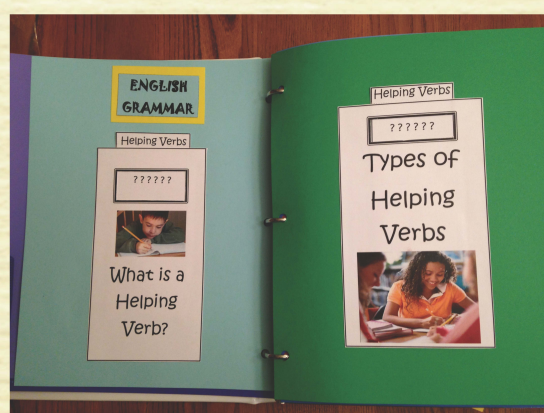
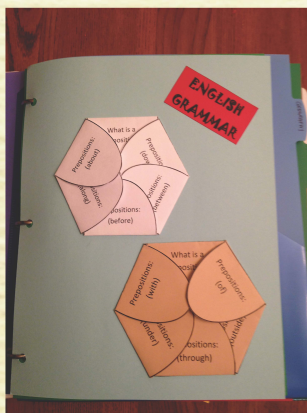
